

7:11 – In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, in the second month, on the seventeenth day of the month, on that day all the fountains of the great deep burst forth, and the windows of the heavens were opened.



This verse gives us the two sources of the flood waters:

- 1. The springs of the great deep burst forth
 - a. A tidal wave caused by the eruption of the ocean waters, a tsunami.
 - b. "<u>All</u> the springs of the great deep burst forth." These springs are mentioned in Genesis 2:6 as "streams" or "mists" that came up out of the ground.
 - c. "Burst forth" is "baga", the same word used in

- i. Numbers 16:31 where an earthquake splits the earth and Korah and his followers are swallowed up.
- ii. Psalm 78:15 where God split the rock in Exodus 17:6
- d. It is possible that an earthquake set off the release of water pressurized under the continental plates up into the atmosphere.
 - i. These waters would have began falling instantly
 - ii. Some would have frozen in the upper atmosphere and fell like ice around the globe
 - iii. Some would have condensed into vapor and fell like rain during the next 40 days.
 - iv. This upward shot water also could have penetrated the waters above the atmosphere (sky) from Genesis 1:7 causing it ("flood gates of heaven") to fall to the earth
- e. Continental Plates and continental drift. Genesis 10:24 refers to the earth being divided. Genesis 1:9 records that all the water was gathered to one place thus there would have been a single continental land mass. This is called Pangaea by geologists and other today. It was the super-continent.

^{7:12 -} And rain fell upon the earth forty days and forty nights.

7:13 — On the very same day Noah and his sons, Shem and Ham and Japheth, and Noah's wife and the three wives of his sons with them entered the ark,

- 7:14 they and every beast, according to its kind, and all the livestock according to their kinds, and every creeping thing that creeps on the earth, according to its kind, and every bird, according to its kind, every winged creature.
- 7:15 They went into the ark with Noah, two and two of all flesh in which there was the breath of life.
- 7:16 And those that entered, male and female of all flesh, went in as God had commanded him. And the Lord shut him in.
- 7:17 The <u>flood continued forty days on the earth</u>. The waters increased and bore up the ark, and it rose high above the earth.
- 7:18 The waters prevailed and increased greatly on the earth, and the ark floated on the face of the waters.
- 7:19 And the waters prevailed so mightily on the earth that all the high mountains under the whole heaven were covered.
- 7:20 The waters prevailed above the mountains, covering them fifteen cubits deep (22 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet).
- 7:21 And all flesh died that moved on the earth, birds, livestock, beasts, all swarming creatures that swarm on the earth, and all mankind.
- 7:22 Everything on the dry land in whose nostrils was the breath of life died.
- 7:23 He blotted out every living thing that was on the face of the ground, man and animals and creeping things and birds of the heavens. They were blotted out from the earth. Only Noah was left, and those who were with him in the ark.
- 7:24 And the waters prevailed on the earth 150 days.
- 8:1 But God remembered Noah and all the beasts and all the livestock that were with him in the ark. And God made a wind blow over the earth, and the waters subsided.



- The reversal of events begins with God
- 2. Everything depends on God to change. Here history goes from total destruction to deliverance.
- "remembered" is Hebrew zakar and is covenant language. God is acting in agreement with a covenant he made. He is showing himself faithful to his word.
- 4. "Recede" is used 4x and "Dry" 3x



- 1. 7 days waiting on the ark or loading the ark
- 2. 150 days the water prevailed on the earth (the first 40 of the 150 was the water coming)

- 3. 150 days the water receded
- 4. 70 days the earth dried

8:4 — and in the seventh month, on the seventeenth day of the month, the ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat.

 "Ararat" was the large territory that bordered the northern Mesopotamian area. Its boundaries included southeast Turkey, southern Russia, northwest Iran. In this mountainous area in the country of Armenia there is a mountain peak that is called Mount Ararat. It is 17,000 feet high. This verse here says the ark landed not on a mountain peak called Mt. Ararat, but in this mountainous region called Ararat.



8:5 – And the <u>waters continued to abate until the tenth month</u>; in the tenth month, on the first day of the month, the tops of the mountains were seen.

8:6 - At the end of forty days Noah opened the window of the ark that he had made

1. It will take 4 weeks to send the birds out 4 times.

8:7 – and sent forth a raven. It went to and fro until the waters were dried up from the earth.

- 1. Noah's birds:
 - a. Week #1 Raven, did not return, but flew around
 - b. Week #2 Dove, returned because it found no place to land
 - c. Week #3 Dove, returned with olive branch
 - d. Week #4 Dove, did not return. It found a place to land.
- 2. "raven" is a strong bird and feeds on the carcass of dead animals. This bird probably found plenty of food on the mountain peaks.
- 3. In the epic of Gilgamesh the dove and the swallow return because they could not find a place to perch, but the raven sent out by <u>Utnapishtim</u> (Noah of the Sumerian myth) does not return. Here's details:
 - a. In the Epic of Gilgamesh, Utnapishtim sends out birds to find land after his ship lands on Mount Nisir following the Great Deluge:
 - b. <u>Dove</u>: After 12 days on the water, Utnapishtim opens the hatch of his ship and sends out a dove to see if the water has receded. The dove returns, having found no place to roost.
 - c. Swallow: Utnapishtim then sends out a swallow, which also returns.
 - d. Raven: Finally, Utnapishtim sends out a raven, which circles around and does not return.

8:8 – Then he sent forth a dove from him, to see if the waters had subsided from the face of the ground.

8:9 – But the dove found no place to set her foot, and she returned to him to the ark, for the waters were still on the face of the whole earth. So he put out his hand and took her and brought her into the ark with him.

- 8:10 He waited another seven days, and again he sent forth the dove out of the ark.
- 8:11 And the dove came back to him in the evening, and behold, in her mouth was a freshly plucked olive leaf. So Noah knew that the waters had subsided from the earth.
 - 1. Olive trees:
 - a. difficult to kill
 - b. resprout easily.
 - c. Grow best on hillsides, not high elevations
 - 2. The olive leaf indicated to Noah that the lower elevations had drained and vegetation was sprouting
 - 3. Doves live in the valleys.
- 8:12 Then he waited <u>another seven days</u> and sent forth the dove, and she did not return to him anymore.
- 8:13 In the six hundred and first year, in the first month, the first day of the month, the waters were dried from off the earth. And Noah removed the covering of the ark and looked, and behold, the face of the ground was dry.
- 8:14 In the second month, on the twenty-seventh day of the month, the earth had dried out.
- 8:15-16 Then God said to Noah, "Go out from the ark, you and your wife, and your sons and your sons' wives with you.
- 8:17 Bring out with you every living thing that is with you of all flesh—birds and animals and every creeping thing that creeps on the earth—that they may swarm on the earth, and be fruitful and multiply on the earth."
- 8:18 So Noah went out, and his sons and his wife and his sons' wives with him.
- 8:19 Every beast, every creeping thing, and every bird, everything that moves on the earth, went out by families from the ark.
